Workshop Overview

The United States Department of Transportation invests in the future of transportation through its University Transportation Centers (UTC) Program, which awards and administers grants to consortia of colleges and universities across the United States. The UTC Program advances the state-of-the-art in transportation research and technology, and develops the next generation of transportation professionals. The Congressionally-mandated program has been in place since 1987. Currently, there are over 35 active UTC programs in the US.

This workshop will introduce the UTC program and then provide examples of successful technology transfer initiatives that have had a positive impact on our nations transportation system. With the recent passage of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act the UTC program is funded at approximately \$100 million per year and there will be a new competition in 2022. The focus of the workshop will be on how ASCE members can participate in this important program.
